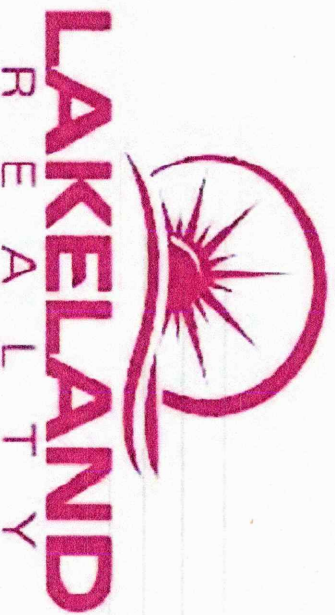


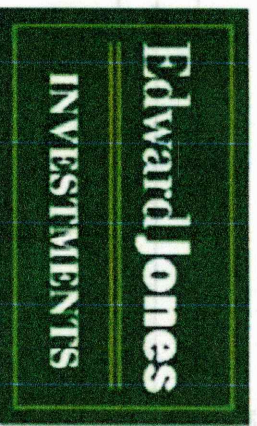

Eligibility:

Participation is open to artists in any medium in Kentucky, Tennessee, Indiana, and Illinois. All submitted work must be original and completed within the last three years (2019 or later). This is a Juried exhibit and work submitted is not assured display in the show.

Important Dates:

- October 5th-8th 2022:** Deliver entries during regular gallery hours. **Digital Entries through 10/8/2022 – Art to be Juried October 11-13**
- Artists will be notified regarding juror's selections.
- Oct. 14, 2022:** Exhibition opens. Join us for a reception that evening from 6-8PM during which, awards will be presented.
- Oct 15, 2022:** Deadline for artwork NOT selected to be picked up.
- November 26, 2022:** Last day of exhibit.
- December 1st:** Deadline for artwork in the exhibit to be picked up.

Submission Process:

Artwork may be shipped or hand-delivered to the museum at 71 Main Street, Cadiz, KY, 42211. Non-refundable entry fees are due at time of entry. You may submit up to three works. NOTE: 2D work must be ready to hang with wires and may not be larger than 8 feet in any direction; 3D work must weigh less than 150 pounds.

Sale of Artwork:

Work selected for the exhibition may be made available for sale. JMAM assesses a 25% commission on any work sold from the exhibition and will collect and remit Kentucky sales tax. Please ensure that prices listed on entry tags reflect the commission. Mark entries NFS if they are not for sale. **Note:** No artwork will leave the galleries before the close of the exhibition.

Selection Process: Artwork will be selected by the juror, all selections final.

Entry Fees:

One Entry: \$15 members / \$20 non-members

Two Entries: \$25 members / \$30 non-members

Three Entries: \$35 members / \$40 non-members

All Awards to be Distributed Per the Juror's Decision

The Janice Mason Art Museum is a 501(c)3 non-profit. Our mission is to bring the arts to Cadiz, Trigg County, and the surrounding region. The museum is located at 71 Main Street in Cadiz, Kentucky, in a former WPA-era post office. Galleries are open Tuesday-Saturday 10am-4pm and Sunday 1-4pm. 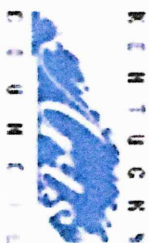
